LIST OF THE COWEN SISTERS' WORKS

The sisters Gertrude Barber, Minnie Cowen, and Ray Sayer produced a large number of abstracts of and indexes to records for New York and elsewhere that are useful for genealogical and historical research. The abstracts and indexes as well as some compiled genealogical material that have been identified are presented below, but the list may not be complete.¹ Titles vary among different collections, so this list is briefly descriptive. Organized by state, then county, it was compiled from the online catalogues of Library of Congress, New York Public Library (including material formerly in The New York Genealogical and Biographical Society library),² Family History Library, New England Historic Genealogical Society,³ Allen County Public Library, New York State Library, New York State Historical Association Library, Onondaga County Public Library, Brooklyn Historical Society, and, for Gertrude Barber only, her entry in "Who's Who in Genealogy,"⁴ and Ruth L. Hand's "Gertrude Audrey Barber."⁵

Clearly, no one library has all of the sisters' works, and dates of "publication" are widely inconsistent from one catalogue to another. Some libraries have multi-volume collections of cemetery inscriptions and, to a lesser extent, of church records; in other locations, the abstracts for one or just a few cemeteries (or churches) are found individually. Adding some confusion is that Gertrude Barber retyped some works compiled by Minnie Cowen and re-issued them under her own name. Furthermore, conflicting range dates for indexed and abstracted records are found in the cataloged items, which have been reconciled as much as possible from personal examination. For example, in many cases the beginning date of will abstracts in some titles is

the date that the first will listed was written, not the earliest probate date. Another example concerns the fourth volume of Queens County will abstracts, where the title page shows inclusive dates 1843–1850, but the abstracts end with wills probated 23 November 1848. Nearly all works have surname indexes.

In the listings below, the subject order for each geographical area is wills (indexes, abstracts), administrations, deeds, censuses, cemetery inscriptions, church records, newspaper items, and miscellaneous. Because of space limitations, collections of grave marker inscriptions are only listed with locations—towns, villages, hamlets, cities—and not with specific cemetery names. The compiler of each item is coded (B=Gertrude A. Barber, C=Minnie Cohen /Cowen, S=Ray C. Sawyer) followed by the year it was issued.
